Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move!

Thursday 31st August we were joined by students from several schools across the Archdiocese for our Mission Ambassador Program for Students Formation Day. We also welcomed Luke Tobin from the Catholic Mission's Formation Team and who is currently Acting Diocesan Director for Sydney, Broken Bay & Parramatta.

This was an opportunity for students to learn more about the program but more importantly how they could be 'mission' in their own communities as ambassadors during World Mission Month and beyond, as well as the advocates for those most in need by sharing their stories in local parishes.

We unpacked the theme for 2023, Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move, which is based on the Emmaus story and engaged in a number of activities throughout our time together.

The Mission Ambassador Program for is a way to depth a missionary awareness and understanding among young people through service learning in action. (Head)

It creates opportunities for young people to follow the model of Jesus as a servant leader in their interactions and engagement with others. (Heart)

It enables Catholic Mission to enact service learning by engaging with various school communities and youth groups in real and authentic action. (Hands)

We were blessed to be joined again this year by Bishop Tim Norton who shared his own story and how 'mission' has been such an important part of his life. He also reflected the Emmaus story and how we 'meet Jesus' in our encounters with others, just as the disciples encountered Jesus on the road.

Sharing the words of Pope Francis, we reminded our young people; "Dear young people, please don't be observers of life, but get involved. Jesus did not remain an observer, but he immersed himself. Don't' be observers but immerse yourself in the reality of life, as Jesus did.' Take heart from these words of Pope Francis. You are not being observers, you are immersing yourselves in the reality of life, just as Jesus did.' We shared the story of Bridget Barber, another young person who is not being an observer but immersing herself in the reality of life, getting involved in a real and authentic way. Bridget works as part of our Communications Team in Sydney. We invited to listen to her story and be inspired.

We are continuing this mission journey either face-to-face or online with our schools to assist them in their preparation to speak on our behalf in their parishes on Mission Sunday weekend.

Our Catholic Mission Team is so grateful to the staff, students and their families for their engagement with the program but most importantly that they are living the mission day message, *Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move!*
