

## Teaching about Jesus- Links in the Curriculum:

Year Prep	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Listen and respond (make connections) to stories of Jesus in the Gospels – Jesus' life as a Jew, his birth, family</li> <li>- Jesus prayed and taught others to pray - prayer helps believers to follow the teachings of Jesus to live according to God's plan</li> <li>- Recognise Jesus' teachings about love, compassion and forgiveness that challenged people about the way they were living – students look at Bible stories such as the Creation story, David and Goliath and Joseph the Dreamer</li> <li>- Retelling the Easter story through imaginative play, use of illustrations or images - Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection</li> <li>- Investigate and report on what Jewish families were like in the time of Jesus</li> </ul>
Year One	<p><b>Beliefs</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jesus called people, including 'the twelve', to share in his mission and ministry.</li> <li>• Jesus participated in the life of the Jewish community.</li> </ul> <p><b>Scared Texts</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John provide particular insights into the life and teaching of Jesus</li> </ul> <p><b>Christian Life</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jesus prayed regularly and taught others how to pray. Prayer involves talking and listening to God, either alone or gathered as community. Believers pray with the help of word, music, action, silence, images, symbols and nature. Prayer in the Christian tradition, including Marian prayer, nurtures the spiritual life of believers.</li> <li>• Mary, Mother of Jesus, has been honoured in many ways by Christians both past and present (e.g. prayer, images, music). The Hail Mary is a Catholic prayer, using words of <a href="#">scripture</a> (Luke 1:26-28; Luke 1:39-42) and developed over a long period of time.</li> </ul>
Year Two	<p>Church – People of God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Church community draws from the teachings and actions of Jesus (e.g. actions of Jesus: praying, forgiving and helping people in need; teachings of Jesus: love, justice and peace) to guide the way they live.</li> </ul> <p>Beliefs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jesus lived a truly human life. His mission and ministry was to preach and bring about the kingdom of God, including through his teaching, healing and forgiving.</li> </ul>
Year Three	<p>The life and teachings of Jesus- Words and actions of Jesus.          Jesus is the Messiah - communicating an understanding of the term Messiah          Making links to Jesus' life and how it reveals him as the Messiah-          Communicate ideas about the life and teachings of Jesus.          Learning about Jesus through Gospel          Jesus' teaching of the Beatitudes - as a basis for Christian morals          Jesus' commandment to respect basic human rights</p>

Year Four	<p>Make connections between Jesus' healing ministry, including giving sight to a blind man at Jericho and the Church's healing ministry in the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.</p> <p>Recognising stories from the New Testament that tell about Jesus' life as a Jew. Explain what Jewish families were like in the time of Jesus.</p> <p>The practices of each Church community (including the parish and diocese) are modelled on the mission and ministry of Jesus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Make connections between the practices of Church communities and the mission and ministry of Jesus</li> </ul> <p>Students explain how practices and characteristics of contemporary parishes and dioceses are modelled on the mission and ministry of Jesus. They demonstrate an understanding of how the celebrations of Anointing of the Sick and Penance continue Jesus' mission and ministry in the life of the community.</p>

Year Six	<p>Beliefs: Jesus' relationship with God the Father and humanity Make links between images and the titles that express Jesus</p> <p>Christian Life: Teaching of Jesus' New Law</p>
Year Seven	<p>Life and ministry of Jesus Positioning of character in story- trial of Jesus New Testament-how each gospel depicts Jesus-historical truth, factual truth, religious truth Trinity/ Nicene Creed Church: Liturgical Year- Christmas, Easter, Lent Sacraments of the church and the life and ministry of Jesus</p>
Year Eight	<p>Beliefs: Christians believe that the mission of Jesus is continued in the world and in the Church through the activity of the Holy Spirit. Scripture recounts God's saving plan for all creation. Christians believe that God's saving plan was accomplished through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Christian Life: Assisted by the Holy Spirit, the Church draws on the teaching of Jesus and its living Tradition to respond to emerging moral questions.</p> <p>Beliefs: Scripture recounts God's saving plan for all creation. Christians believe that God's saving plan was accomplished through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Locate references in the NT texts that recount God's saving plan fulfilled through Jesus.</p> <p>Beliefs: The mystery of the Trinity is a fundamental belief of Christianity. The <b>Trinity</b> is One - one God in three interrelated persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.</p>

	Liturgy and Sacraments: Through Baptism, people become members of the Body of Christ....participating in the ongoing mission of Jesus.
